
Dear Magalie R. Sala,

**RE: Sahko Hydro License 11060 - Article 406 Requirement: 2006 Annual Monitoring Report**

This report is to satisfy Article 406 with respect to the following requirements:

- “(1) that on or about each July 31 this “cascade” area of the canyon wall be re-photographed with approximately the same locations as the 1997 and 2002 photographs, identified as Photo Points A & B on the January 2004 submissions to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and Idaho Department of Fish and Game;
- (2) that on or about each July 31 the stream sides be revisited in person with sample measurements taken to verify that the average “stream based riparian” coverage has not decreased below the approximate ten (10) feet on each side of the stream;
- (3) that an overlay be made on the annual photographs to indicate “stream based riparian” delineations along with associated calculations. A comparison to each previous year’s photos and riparian delineated areas would then be done;”

**Cascade Benchmark Photographs – Requirements (1) & (3)  
2006 Cascade Photos**

In order to meet the requirements specified in (1), photographs of the cascade were taken on approximately August 30, 2006 from approximately the same locations as the 1997 and 2002 benchmark photographs, identified as Photo Points A & B.

Enclosed (**Attachment #1**) are three photographs to document the summer 2006 condition of riparian shrubs growing in the “cascade” area on the canyon wall as shown from approximately Photo Point A. (Photos # A-2006-1, 2, 3) In order to meet the requirements specified in (3), the photos in Attachment #1 have been overlayed with stream based riparian areas delineated in green for comparison with the benchmark photos in Attachment #3.

**Attachment #2** is a photograph to document the summer 2006 condition of the entire lower end of the project as shown from approximately Photo Point B. (Photo B-2006-1)


Three photographs are attached (**Attachment #3**) to document the 2005 condition of riparian shrubs growing in the "cascade" area on the canyon wall as shown from Photo Point A. (Photos # A-2005-1x, 2x, 3x) These photos were taken in summer 2005 and document the "cascade" area on the canyon wall beginning just above the small waterfall at the top, and ending at the location for the powerhouse and tailrace area at the bottom, a length of about 900 feet and a vertical drop of about 275 feet. Stream based riparian areas have been delineated on the photographs in green.

Also attached (**Attachment #4**) is a photograph taken in summer 2005 (Photo B-2005-1). This photo includes the entire lower end of the project area including the subject "cascade" area on the canyon wall as shown from Photo Point B.

**Riparian Measurements – Requirement (2)**

On August 28, 2006, I visited the Cascade area stream sides to make measurements of the riparian area as specified in (2). According to my measurements, the "stream based riparian" coverage has not decreased below approximately 10 feet on each side of the stream.

I am writing to register my opposition to the proposed LNG 'tanker' to be stationed in Long Island Sound, between New York and Connecticut.


