I am totally appalled at the failure to timely publish this appeal process in the Federal Register. The DOC is fully aware of this process and the stakes involved, and has been for some time. If decisions regarding the briefing process can be discussed and decided, the publishing in the Federal Register can also be completed.

This lack of a timely publishing process smells like political gamesmanship. Your lack of timely pursuit of this appeal has everyone questioning your role in this process as an enabler for the energy industry. While everyone acknowledges that FERC has completely bungled this particular application and the NEPA process, your blatant attempt to push this process and decision past election day is further evidence of government complicity. We are aware that Millennium is spreading their influence and money this summer in Washington. It would be most unfortunate to see that the lessons of Enron have been ignored.

While the President is currently exploring how he can restore individual investor confidence in the stock market and the economy due to the total betrayal and crimes committed by corporate officers, your blatant pursuit of a political strategy will only further erode citizen confidence and faith in our government. At this point in time, and with what has transpired in the country over the past year, this is a rather risky strategy that you are promoting.
