As noted in your comment letter dated February 19, 2008, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration/National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA/NMFS) have provided general comments and recommendations regarding the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) which was published by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) on January 11, 2008 for the Broadwater Energy LLC and Broadwater Pipeline LLC liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminal in Long Island Sound.

Broadwater appreciates the comments outlined in the NOAA/NMFS correspondence that provide additional detail on the conclusions and recommendations that were published in the FEIS. The key measures noted by NOAA/NMFS are consistent with the approach Broadwater has taken to both project design and implementation to ensure that any potential environmental impacts are avoided, minimized, and mitigated. Therefore, Broadwater agrees to adopt and implement all recommended mitigation measures made by NOAA/NMFS during project construction and operation.

Broadwater continues to engage with Federal and State agencies throughout the project approval process and will maintain ongoing coordination and communication with NOAA/NMFS and FERC to ensure all issues are addressed during the consultation process. We look forward to setting up a meeting with NOAA/NMFS to discuss these measures in detail in the coming weeks.
