**INFORMATIVE MOTION REQUESTING
PRPB'S INNITIAL BRIEF BE DEEMED UNTIMELY
AND SUBMITTING DOCUMENT JUST DISCOVERED**

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY:

COMES NOW, Petitioner Villa Marina Yacht Harbour, Inc. ("VMYH"), through the undersigned attorney who very respectfully informs, states and moves as follows:

1. Petitioner received on April 5, 2004 Notice from NOAA granting the Puerto Rico Planning Board ("PRPB") request of a 30 day extension to file its initial brief, extending the date to May 3, 2004, although petitioner never received a copy of such request from the PRPB, and petitioner filed objection to the same when received.

2. As indicated by the Postmark on the envelope with the PRPB's Inntial Brief, it was mailed past the deadline and extension given by NOAA, as it is marked May 4, 2004 (Exhibit A).

3. PRPB'S brief was mailed after the contested extension expired¹, thus it should be

¹ NOAA had provided a stay and had informed both parties no further extensions or stays would be granted, then the PRPB unilaterally, knowingly and specifically without Petitioner's consent, and without notification to Petitioner, requested a 30 day extension to file its brief, which was granted by NOAA before

interpreted as received late and not accepted.

4. Petitioner filed its initial brief on time and with no further extensions

5. In addition, an endorsement letter issued by the U.S. Coast Guard, essential to the discussion of the present case, that was mentioned in our previous "Informative Motion" was not delivered to Petitioner until a couple of days ago (May 11, 2004) by Ms. Ortiz of the PRPB. This letter issued by the U.S. Coast Guard, the expert agency consulted in terms of safety and navigation, was never produced to Petitioner although we had requested the same in various occasions and Petitioner requests the letter be included in its brief (Exhibit B).

Wherefore, "VMYIF" hereby request that the PRPB Brief be deemed untimely and not considered, and that the U.S. Coast Guard Letter dated October 10, 2003 be included as part of Petitioner's Initial Brief.


