On May 9, 2002, the New York Department of State issued its determination:

The Department of State's decision found that the proposal was inconsistent with the provisions of the federal Coastal Zone Management Act and violated its policies in several ways by:

Adversely affecting the State-designated Haverstraw Bay Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat.

Not adequately addressing concerns regarding the drinking water supply for New York City and some Westchester Communities.

- Being inconsistent with the Village of Croton-on-Hudson's Local Waterfront Revitalization Program.*

Teatown's preserve would be severely impacted by this pipeline route, as would the watershed in which it plays a major role. Teatown's wetlands, lake and streams are currently providing vital protection to the Croton Reservoir by filtering pollution through wetland plants and preventing flooding through the many systems available in the natural environment.
