This letter is in reference to the pending Broadwater Facility in the Long Island Sound, N.Y.. I am against this project for the following several reasons.

- 1) This Being the largest holding facility of LNG (LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS) in the USA the security issues are enormous. It would be an easy target for terrorist attacks.
- 2) The expense of the Coast Guard needed to secure and escort the incoming tankers for downloading and refueling the LNG into this facility.
- 3) Time taken away from the Coast Guard to patrol the sound to better protect our waters.
- 4) LNG facility endangers the health and safety of Long Island Sound and should not be built.
- 5) This facility limits public access and sets a dangerous precedent of industrializing the Sound.
- 6) Dangerous possibilities of leaking LNG, since this is a proto type facility.
- 7) There is no local or regional need for this facility that justifies installing it in the L.I. Sound especially compared to the environmental impact it would cause.
- 8) There have not been any long term environmental or local impact studies made as to what we can expect in the future to fish, wildlife and marine changes due to this proposed facility.
- 9) The people and State of Long Island and Connecticut are completely against having Broadwater LNG proposed facility within the shores of the Long Island Sound.

Please take into consideration our letter and in hopes that we the people DO have a say in what is allowed within our shores and not allow big business such as Shell oil and Broadwater continue with this proposal.
