
I am apposed to the Broadwater venture between Shell Oil and TransCanada that proposes to place a Liquefied Natural Gas terminal in the middle of the Long Island Sound.

There are a number of environmental concerns associated with this venture. The Long Island Sound does not need a costly, risky, LNG barge. Furthermore, armed private security would disrupt the peaceful tranquil waters of Long Island Sound.
