Putting in the LNG plant worries me greatly. The tide differential where the St. Croix River meets the Narrows of the Bay of Fundy is 28 to 30 feet. There is a huge Eddy there, a swirl of meeting waters where the ingoing and outgoing tides meet. The area is pristine and exquisite. It is very tricky for large ships to navigate those waters. Why would you allow this area to be jeopardized by the possibility of fire and gas explosions, water and air pollution and the unsightliness of the plant and it's emissions.
