
Dear Secretary Evans,

I am writing you to plead for your rejection of the Millennium Pipeline request to go ahead with construction which is in violation of the New York Department of State ruling that the project violates the State Coastal Zone Management Act. This ruling is the result of studies that demonstrate the devastating impact of the proposed Millennium Project to the Hudson River, *and* the New York City Watershed. Since the pipeline siting is just five miles south of the Indian Point Nuclear Energy plant in Buchanan, New York, it is also a threat to the safety of millions of people within the 50 mile radius of the Indian Point Nuclear Energy plant in Buchanan, New York.

Millennium proposes to run its pipeline by blasting under both the Hudson River and the Croton Rivers, demolishing the forest and wetland protections around the Croton Dam thus endangering New York City's water supply, and rock cutting adjacent to the Con Edison electricity lines which run through Westchester County to empower New York City. This potential disaster endangers the livelihood, even lives, of millions of United States citizens, constituents of this government.

Please consider carefully your response to the Millennium Pipeline proposal bearing in mind its threat to the safety of those of us dependent on you, the national government, to protect us.
